WANT TO HIRE A MOORING?



Sadgroves Creek in the inner Darwin harbour meanders further inland past DBCYA and contains a mix of both privately owned and NT Government owned moorings.

Note: Dinah Beach Cruising Yacht Association does not own or manage any private moorings for rent.

PRIVATELY OWNED MOORINGS

Several swing moorings are privately owned and are sometimes available for rent. Place a Notice of Interest on this noticeboard to or speak directly with club members that moor vessels in the area.

GOVERNMENT OWNED MOORINGS

The Frances Bay Marine Facilities operate 45 moorings – 14 x Swing Moorings and 28 x Fore & Aft Moorings.

The NTG Sadgroves Creek moorings are available to vessel owners for a rental fee of \$3.41 (inc GST) per day. To utilise an NTG mooring an owner must have (and provide) the following:

- Proof of identity (NT Drivers Licence or Passport)
- Copies of Certificates of Insurance / Certificates of Currency comprehensive public liability insurance for \$10 million per claim;
- A side view photo of the vessel showing vessel name and registration

No vessels are permitted onto the NTG moorings without a confirmed booking and satisfying the above criteria.

ALREADY OWN A MOORING?

Private mooring owners please be aware that the Regional Harbour Master has recently introduced a standard for all moorings within the Port of Darwin. The DARWIN BUOY MOORING STANDARDS applies to all private and commercial moorings and extends to all existing and new moorings within Darwin Harbour including Sadgroves Creek.

A copy of these standards are on the DBCYA noticeboard – mooring owners are encouraged to familiarise themselves with their legal requirements in relation to permits, mooring maintenance etc. The Regional Harbour Master now has the authority to remove non-compliant moorings.

No new moorings are to be put down in Sadgroves Creek without prior application to and confirmation from the Darwin Harbour Master.
